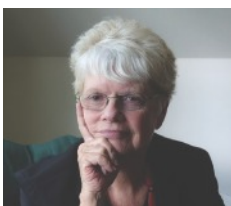

This intensive two day seminar is offered for psychotherapists presently incorporating neurofeedback into their work with developmental trauma.

This seminar is designed to address the learning needs of each participant as they relate to working with developmental trauma and its long and chaotic aftermath. In the last year there have been two very important studies published on neurofeedback and trauma. We will review the latest breakthroughs in the neuroscience of trauma and how they apply to the development of neurofeedback protocols. We'll go over protocols that have proven helpful to most patients with these histories and what to consider when they're not. We'll discuss the complex nature of trauma in the brain, mind and sense of identity and how to understand and engage with the fields that trauma creates in our patients and in us. We'll discuss the pragmatic issues in the integration of brain and mind approaches (behavioral, dynamic, experiential or analytic) but perhaps, even more importantly, we will grapple with the meaning of the changes we see. We will talk about all of this using case examples that the seminar leader and participants bring.
